

# Discovery Grants for Students



## Fact Sheet for Students

Do you have a special area of interest, or a possible career path that you would like to learn more about? You can explore it beyond the classroom by proposing a self-directed project and applying for a grant of up to \$100 from the KJ7 Education Foundation!

### Here's how it works:

- ◆ You are eligible to apply if you are enrolled for the current academic year in elementary, middle or high school in Kendrick Joint School District #283.
- ◆ Select a topic of interest you want to explore, and think of a project that will build related knowledge or skills. Remember that you must work on your own time!
- ◆ Choose a teacher who knows about your subject area, talk with him/her about the project, and ask him/her to be your Teacher Advisor.
- ◆ Apply individually or as a group, using the official application form.
- ◆ Turn in your application by the deadline. It must be signed by your Teacher Advisor and the School Principal.
- ◆ Grants of up to \$100 will be awarded by lottery, based on funds available. Suggested grant request amounts are \$25, \$50, \$75 or \$100.
- ◆ The project must be completed by the date specified, and a Project Report must be submitted to the Foundation describing the results and what you learned.
- ◆ Grants will not be awarded to fund the purchase or maintenance of livestock or pets.

### Granting Cycles:

**First:** October 15<sup>th</sup> through February 15<sup>th</sup>

**Second:** January 15<sup>th</sup> through May 15<sup>th</sup>

Dates for application deadlines, grant award announcements, and grant report deadlines will be announced before each cycle.
